
Ely was the baronies of Ikerrin and Eliogarty in County Tipperary and Ballybritt and most of Clonlisk in County Offaly.

O'Carroll Castles: Birr (chief of clan), Kinnity, Dunkerrin and Emmell.

Long Anthony Carroll:

- ~1649 – Emmell was the last castle to fall to Cromwell's Conquest
- 1676 – Colonel John Rose sold Emmell to Anthony Carroll (The Long)
- 1689 – Anthony Carroll commissioned as Captain in KJA (King James Army)
- ~1690 – Anthony Carroll became a Colonel
- 1691 – Anthony defended Nenagh Castle against Williamite forces
Anthony attacked and defeated a Dutch force at Barra bog
- 1712 – Long Anthony awarded his cousin James of Tulla – Lishenalclouta, Garrynamony and other townlands in the Barony of Upper Ormonde, Co. Tipperary. This award was for James's military service during the above action.
- 1722 – Richard Carroll, grandson of Anthony, sold the last of his inheritance of Long Anthony's land and holdings.
