First I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Ann Robson All my Household Furniture consisting of Beds, Bedsteads, and other Articles and Utensils And also All such Sum or Sums of Money as are or may become due to me on account or by virtue of the last Will of my Brother Amos Charlton late of Widdow in the County of Cumberland deceased whether the said Property be in the Hands of Whosoever Morally the Executor of my said Brother's Will or in the Hands of Joseph Liddale of Northhouse in the County of Cumberland Esq<sup>r</sup> And also I give and bequeath unto my said Grand Daughter the Sum of Six Pounds now in the Hands of Thomas Coates Jun<sup>r</sup> of Lipwood for the purpose of defraying my Funeral Charges and Expenses And all the rest residue and remainder of my Mortal Goods and Effects of what nature or kind soever I give and bequeath to my said Grand Daughter Ann Robson, And I do hereby nominate and appoint my said Grand Daughter Ann Robson sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former and other Will or Wills at any time heretofore by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Seventeenth Day of May One Thousand Eight Hundred and One
