I me John Newbold of Birmingham in the County of Warwick plumber and at the  
place first of will and direct that all my just debts my funeral expenses and the expenses of  
proving and executing this my Will be fully paid and satisfied all the Rest and Residue  
of my property of whatsoever or kind whatsoever I give devise and bequeath to my dear wife  
wife Elizabeth Ann Newbold the above Executors Administrators and Assigns absolutely for a  
full and benefit of her maintaining supporting and educating our Children so far as  
as she may be able and of this my will nominate and appoint my Executor in law and  
kinsman William Wilcock and James Pallett Executors and hereby revoking all former  
and other Wills or Wills by me at any time before made and do declare this only to be  
my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have to this my last Will set my  
hand and seal this twenty eighth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand  
thousand eight hundred and thirty four—John Newbold—*(Signature)*—Signed sealed published  
and declared by the Testator John Newbold as and for his last Will and Testament in the  
presence of us who at his request in his presence and in the presence of said other above  
named subscribed our names—Sarah Wilcock—Charlotte Vaughan

 command or expectancy (the Copysold part of which I have surrendered to the use of my  
 will unto my said Youngest son Henry Alfred aforesaid to have and to hold the same in  
 effects Copysold and elsewhere where soe lands tenements hereditaments and all  
 Real and Personal Estate unto the said Henry Alfred his executors and  
 administrators and assigns according to the nature and quality of the said Estates to  
 for his and their own absolute use and benefit for ever and lastly I recollect all wells by  
 me at any time heretofore made in writing wherof I have to this my last will and  
 Testament contained in two sheets of paper affixed together to the first sheet thereof set  
 my hand and to this second and last sheet thereof set my hand and seal the sixteenth day  
 of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight - Richd.
