Address Given as 17 Farnham Terrace, Sunderland England

Applied for free passage to England

Sailed on "City of Karachi" from Sydney on 26 Nov 1918

Explained that his father was not in good health

"...my own health being a total wreck".

He seeks reimbursement of his passage

Response is that his letter is being passed to the Comptroller in Queensland

3 Jun 1919 Copy of his discharge certificate is sent to his address in England
