We hereby certify that upon examination we find the following objective conditions:

Rheumatism

Right - shoulder slightly swollen.  
tender and limited in motion and slight  
no other evidence of rheumatism  
Discharge of heart.

Area of cardiac dullness not increased. Aortic insufficiency is found at left intercostal space just within mammary line. Left heart - irregular heart action. Left ventricular hypertrophy. Considerable dyspnea. No edema, or cyanosis.

the abdominal sounds are heard over either lung.  
Liver.  
Upper border corresponds with sixth rib,  
lower with tenth and does not extend below the  
ribs.

Urine analysis. Color amber, reactions acid.  
Sp gr 1.020. W albumen. W sugar. Skin clear.  
No throat redness or chaps. No coughing.  
Palms of hands somewhat calloused.  
Nervous habits.

no scars on genital or gape. no enlarged glands, no substantial thickens. no unusual plates or bony nodules. no markings of vicious habit.

no other disability found to report.

we find that the aggregate permanent disability for earning a support of manual labor is about 100,000,000 and this is of heart, but due to vicious habits, and want of a rate of 6, a month.
