I hereby give and bequeath to My Dear Wife Harriett Whitehead the whole of my Effects consisting of all my Goods, Chattels, Movable &c, as also the Amount of Assurance effected upon my life in the London Life Association, in the Year 1849 - and such other Properties to which I may have been entitled at the time of my Decease, for her sole use, and for the purpose of bringing up such portions of my children until they arrive at an age capable of maintaining themselves - (subject to the payment of all my just debts, Funeral and Testamentary expenses)

It is furthermore my desire (that in the event of the Decease of My Dear Wife, the aforesaid Harriett Whitehead) that whatever property may remain it shall be equally divided among my then surviving children of her Body by others

I also hereby appoint My Dear Wife Harriett Whitehead Executrix - and My Brother in Law, Mr. Edward White Executor of this My last Will and Testament - Dated this Twenty Ninth Day of August in the Year of Our Lord, Eighteen Hundred and Fifty Nine Thomas Whitehead
