Under them is the following Inscription: To the Memory | of Robert Harris, Citizen, | and Apothecary of London; eminent for his Skill, Humanity, | Integrity in his Profession; | blessed with a Heart to enjoy the | plentiful Fortune he acquired | generous in employing it to the Benefit of his Family, the Service of his Friends, | and the Relief of the Necessitous. | He was elected Master of the Company | of Apothecaries in the year 1738 | By a right Conduct in that Station, | and in every other part of Life, | he gained the universal Character of an honest and good Man. | He died Sept: 24, 1739 | in the 70 year of his Age.
