Edward Turner and Elizabeth Wilkins

Elizabeth Wilkins was from Tisbury, Wiltshire, daughter of **William Wilkins** and **Mary Everett**.

Elizabeth, daughter of William and Mary Wilkins was baptized February 2nd, 1794, at St. John the Baptist, Tisbury, Wiltshire. William Wilkins and Mary Everett were married 31 October 1790 at Tisbury, both of this parish. Other children born to them include Jane, bapt. 19 Feb 1796; John, bapt. 27 Dec 1799; Mary, bapt. 26 Mar 1802; and William bapt. 24 Mar 1804 all at St. John the Baptist, Tisbury.

Recorded in The Solicitor's Journal & Reporter February 13, 1858, page 315—Wilkins, Betsy, afterwards Betsy Turner, wife of Edward Turner, who resided in Middle Wallop, Hants, in or about the year 1828. Next of kin communicate with Mr. Footser, Solicitor, Andover.

Story of Jane Barnard

Jane Barnard, wife of my great great grandfather Henry James Browning Turner was born 17 Sep 1817 in Chichester, Sussex. Jane's Emigration / Free passage application states that she was living in Somerstown, Chichester, Sussex at the time she decided to emigrate to Australia. Her parents were Richard and Elizabeth (nee Newling) Barnard, who married on 16 May 1808, at Saint Mary's, Portsea, Hampshire. It seems the family, like the Turners, lived at Fishbourne, Chichester.

Jane had a sister Elizabeth and a brother Richard. Elizabeth, Jane and their mother, Elizabeth, came to South Australia on the same ship, the Eden, as Henry James Browning, Turner, a brick maker /farmer, and his brothers. Henry was born in Nether Wallop, Hampshire, but the family seem to have lived mainly round Fishbourne, Chichester, Sussex. Richard, at the last moment, decided against going. Jane and Henry met on the way out to S.A.

The Eden left Portsmouth on February 26th, 1838. However, the journey was delayed for almost a month due to the mouth of the River Thames being frozen. They finally arrived in South Australia on June 24th, 1838.

Jane married Henry James Browning Turner at Holy Trinity Church 30 July 1838.

Elizabeth married Thomas Bright 14 August 1838. Thomas died soon after.

Jane died in Hindmarsh after giving birth to a baby, Henry Turner.

She was buried on 25 May 1839 in West Terrace Cemetery. Records, as to the whereabouts of graves were not kept in those early days. All that is known is that somewhere in the West Terrace Cemetery is the grave of Jane Turner (nee Barnard). She was only twenty years old.

Baby Henry Turner was baptised on 26 May, but died at Hindmarsh, and was buried on 20 September 1839, age 4 months, in West Terrace Cemetery. Like his mother, Jane, there are no records to indicate where his grave might be.

After Jane's death, Elizabeth and her mother, more than likely emotionally shattered by what had befallen them in South Australia, migrated to New Zealand (Bay of Islands), where Elizabeth met and married Henry Howard. They moved back to Australia. Elizabeth died in Bega N.S.W. in 1895. She and Henry had 3 children, John (1842 – 1914), Elizabeth Jane (1844 – ?) and Matilda (1849 – 1915).

Henry Turner, remained in Hindmarsh or thereabouts, eventually marrying Elizabeth Ann Edwards (1826 – 1908), who had arrived from Redruth, Cornwall, with her siblings and parents, as a 13-year-old, in 1840. They were married in 1845, eventually moving out to Mallala to take up farming. They were my great-great-grandparents.

A picture of Elizabeth Barnard has survived the years. It accompanies this piece. Jane would have resembled her I am sure. There is a sadness evident in this portrait, which, given the how the great adventure to South Australia went, is completely understandable.

ZACCHEUS TURNER AND ANN STAKER

Zaccheus and Ann were first cousins. His mother, Jane Staker, and her father, Benjamin Staker were siblings, the children of Zaccheus Staker and Mary Browning. Benjamin Staker was married to Sarah Ruff, daughter of John Ruff and Susan Gatwick, and they resided at Stakers Farm in Yapton.

TURNER, Zaccheus effects under £100 22 February 1866 The Will of Zaccheus Turner late of Yapton in the County of **Sussex** Brewer deceased who died 9 September 1865 at Yapton aforesaid was proved at **Chichester** by the oath of Albert Turner of the City of Chichester Grocer the Son one of the Executors.

Of the eight children of Zaccheus and Ann Turner, two, Caroline and Frederick died young; two, Emma and Albert married and had families; and four, Edwin, Louisa, Jane, and Matilda Ann remained single.

Son, Edwin Turner, is not in the 1841, 1851, or 1861 censuses, suggesting he was in the Navy or Military, or away from England, and having returned before 1871.
