

## THE NEWSBOYS' HOME.

The committee and trustees of the late Newsboys' Home wish to inform the subscribers who have supported this institution for so many years, that the building was transferred to the Everton Red Cross Triangle Lads' Club, branch of the Y.M.C.A., in November, 1919, and that the balance remaining of the reserve fund (£160) has been handed over to the Boys' Summer Camp.

The response to the circular issued by the committee to the subscribers in April, 1919, was overwhelmingly in favour of winding up the institution, as there was no longer any opportunity of carrying on the excellent work it had done in past years; and from that time the collection of subscriptions was discontinued, but the work of the home went on for seven months longer on a reduced scale, until the Everton Red Cross Triangle took it over, and this naturally reduced very considerably the balance of the reserve which the committee had finally to dispose of.

The Everton Red Triangle Lads' Club, when it was still part of the YMCA, acquired a property from the Newsboys' Home for Destitute Boys on Everton Road, not far from its Heyworth Street junction with Breck Road, in November 1919.

T.Price became the club's first champion when he won the 9st.10lbs division at the Liverpool Union of Boys' Clubs finals at the Liverpool Stadium (Pudsey Street) on 25 February 1920. This was the first time the ERT competed against other clubs. W.Brough, W.Colborne and P.Grace finished runners-up in their respective division on the same night. Tarleton did not appear.
