The arms and inscription are both obliterated, but the latter was to this effect:—Here lieth the Body of Thomas Neave, Mercer, who was interred here, the 13th day of September, 1658.

Here lies within the compass of this stone,
Our friend interr'd, and yet not he alone:

On the slab were his arms, (see page 147), impaling *PULHAM*, gules, a pelican, argent, on a chief, or, three crosses, pattee fitchee, sable. At the west end of the tomb, were also his arms, impaling *MEASE*, argent, on a chevron, azure, three lozenges, or, between, three fleur de lis, gules; and at the east end, were the words *MEMENTO MORI*.

* Mr. Goltz enters in his Account Book, under the name of the deceased, the following articles of plate;—"Spoones 4 gilt, 11 white, 1 grate silver and gilt salt, and 2 little ones, one silver and gilt cup, 2 silver bowles, 4 rings, one scale ring with armes, and 30*s*. 1*s*. in gold: the plate weighed 5*l* and 2 ounces, 20*s*. 10*s*." This was probably a legacy left to him by Mr. Neave, during the period that he was ejected from the living, and if so, he evidently sustained a loss, as he adds,—"all received but the plate."

At the western extremity of the church-yard is the Rector's "fair Mansion-house," which, with the garden and pleasure grounds, and the barn and stable, contains two acres, two roods, and twelve perches. There are also eighteen pieces of glebe land belonging to the Living, which consist of upwards of seventy acres, lying much detached within the parish, the particulars of which will appear in the Terrier.

During the last eighteen years, owing to the absence of the Rev. J. Norcross, the Rector,* the duties of this church have been performed by Curates licensed by the Lord Bishop of Norwich, viz :—

The Rev. Edward Davies appointed in 1815, and who died 18th Dec. 1831, and
The Rev. William Greenlaw, who succeeded him in 1832, and is now the officiating minister.

The church of Saxted has also a licensed Curate, viz. the Rev. John Bicker, of Rendham.

The Living of Framlingham with that of Saxted annexed, the estimated yearly value of which is stated to be about £1,300, is the richest of the ten benefices which are in the gift of Pembroke College, (except the vicarage of Soham, in Cambridgeshire), and on death or resignation of the Incumbent for the time being, the Senior Fellow of that society succeeds to it. They have also the appointment of the Reader, which will be noticed under the head of Sir Robert's Charity Estates. The following are the names of the present society, who, as the patrons, are placed in their order of seniority.
