

Sarah Goldsmith

In the Name of God Amen

I Sarah Goldsmith of Charlotte Place in the Parish of Woolwich in the County of Kent widow being of sound mind but aware of the uncertainty of my mortal life do make and declare this my last Will and Testament and first of my wills unto God through the merits of my predecessor my worldly goods of whatsoever of as follows I bequeath unto my son William Goldsmith a two shillings silver spoon a two shillings silver spoon situated in New Street in the parish of St. Pancras Deptford of which to be sold to meet the same expenses of administration and funeral and to pay my just debts to my other executors Goldsmith and Thomas Goldsmith I bequeath my household goods situated at 22^o. 13 in Stans Place in the Parish of Woolwich jointly and now in the occupation of Mr. Augustus Eccles to my son George Goldsmith and to my daughter Sarah Ann Goldsmith my writing desk situated in Charlotte Place jointly and to my daughter Sarah Ann of late bequeathed all my cloths and furniture linen and the bedding of my place my pocket book situated at 22^o. 14 in Stans Place and now in the occupation of my son William aforesaid of which to be sold and the residue of the proceeds after my debts are paid to be equally divided between the wife of my son Sarah who may be living at the time of my death and a brother named and appointed Mr. William Smith of Margate Place in the Parish of Woolwich and Mr. William Ellering of Charlotte Place to be my executors - Sarah Goldsmith X her mark - D. - signed deceased and delivered this 18 day of September 1840 in the presence of - Henry Smith
John Richards - Thomas Richardson.
